About the Library

The Lake Travis Community Library was founded in 1985 and shared a space with the Lake Travis High School Library for over 20 years. In May 2004, voters approved the formation of the Lake Travis Community Library District as a means to create public funding for a regional library. The library district includes Hudson Bend, Lakeway, The Hills, Apache Shores, and Briarcliff.

In March 2011, the library received a generous donation of land from Haythem Dawlett in the Tuscan Village development. The new library opened in February 2013. This 11,000 square foot building includes a meeting space for community use, dozens of public computers, a teen room, study tables, a book sale area, a coffee bar, a patio, and ample space for children's programming.

After decades of planning and saving, the library now has its own building and a bookmobile serving other areas of the library district. Thank you to all those in the community who made this possible!

FAQs

How do I get a library card?

- Have a valid Texas driver's license or other proof of Texas residency
- Fill out an application at the library

How many items can I check out?

- 50 total items
- Including a maximum of 5 children's DVDs,
 5 adult DVDs, and 5 television DVDs

How long can I keep my items?

Two weeks

Can I renew my items?

- Most items are renewable, except for DVDs
- If an item is reserved for another patron, it cannot be renewed
- Items can be renewed twice

How do I renew my items?

- Over the telephone
- In the library
- Online

Do you charge overdue fines?

• Yes, \$0.10 per day per overdue item

Can I reserve an item?

• Yes, place a reserve online or at the library

What is my password?

 Your password is your ten digit phone number or your self selected password
