# **Outreach News from Karen Ballinger**

- The bookmobile continues offering contactless curbside reserve pick up service at 15 of the 26 regularly scheduled bookmobile stops. There are seven stops (six preschools and one Sunday school) that we generally do not visit in the summer. There are two churches that are not meeting in person on Sundays, and two assisted living facilities that are not interested in library services. Library staff remain in touch with contacts at stops to remind them of library services.
- We have increased bookmobile visits at the Briarcliff community center to weekly as it remains our busiest stop for curbside reserve pick up and also the farthest stop in the library district. We are also visiting Emmaus Catholic Parish every other week after the Spanish language mass in the hopes of advertising library services to the Spanish speaking community.
- Library staff have made contactless homebound deliveries to existing homebound delivery patrons, who have appreciated receiving library materials again.
- Karen delivered a box of Books for Babies to the Baylor Scott and White Hospital in Lakeway after they reached out to us requesting more packages.

- Last fiscal year, patrons had 666 total sessions with Mango Languages. The top three languages were Spanish, French, and ESL Spanish.
- LTCL Reviewer in Residence Kim McGee was elected to the Longmont Public Library Board in Colorado!
- Virtual Thursday Summer Reading Program events continue to be very popular with almost 200 people signed up for Dinosaur George's program on July 23rd!
- The Summer Reading Challenge has been met and the Friends of the Library have donated \$500 each to Lake Travis Crisis Ministries and Helping Hand Crisis Ministry of Spicewood.

- Sarah is working to launch a new 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten challenge in Beanstack.
- We have identified a need to help people browse the library and find new books during this time. Linden and Sarah have recorded videos highlighting titles, tech coaches have focused columns on searching the catalog, and Rachel has produced four short YouTube videos to show how to use the catalog. Rachel has also purchased an annual subscription to NextReads. The attractive newsletters will deliver reading recommendations to patron inboxes in a number of different genres such as mysteries, picture books, and thrillers. The newsletters automatically link back to our catalog, making it easy for readers to get more information or to place a hold. Catalog education and highlighting new books will continue to be a priority.
- Rachel and Sarah have helped dozens of people through the new Recommended Reads service launched last month.
- We were not awarded a TSLAC CARES Act grant but we plan to apply again during the next cycle this fall. Regardless of grant funding, we plan to move forward with the \$3,802.85 TFE quote for the outdoor access point to provide WiFi in the parking lot.
- Rachel and all staff are working hard on a survey that we plan to distribute in early August to determine was other library services we can provide while the building is closed to the public.
- Raj has ordered ten more mobile hotspots to add to our circulating collection.
- ABC is maintained our HVAC system on July 7th and have made necessary repairs.
- The next Library District Discussion Group is scheduled on Friday, August 21st and is expected to take place virtually.
- The LTCL website had 7,669 unique visitors and 23,106 visits in the month of June.
- LTCL currently has 13,501 active cardholder accounts.
