



Lake Travis Community Library Hotspot Lending Agreement

Purpose

Lake Travis Community Library lends mobile hotspots to help bridge the digital divide and improve access to information in the library district. Hotspots can be borrowed from the main library and bookmobile.

What is a hotspot?

A hotspot is a mobile wireless device that provides internet access to Wi-Fi enabled devices. Lake Travis Community Library's hotspots are provided through T-Mobile and offer unlimited data.

Eligibility

- Hotspot checkouts are limited to one device per library card.
- The library account must be in good standing.

Borrowing and Returning

- Hotspots may be returned inside the library at the circulation desk, on the bookmobile, or in the audio-visual book drop outside the library.
- Altering or modifying the configuration of the hotspot is prohibited.

Late, Lost, and Damaged Hotspots

- Hotspots three days overdue will be deactivated.
- Lost or damaged hotspots will incur a charge of \$75.00 on the borrower's account.

Using the Hotspot

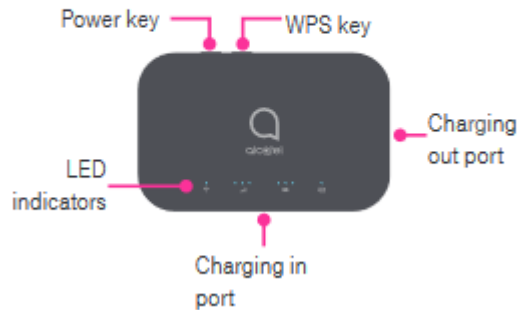
Hotspots provide internet access through the T-Mobile network. To ensure maximum data speed, use the hotspot in an area with a strong T-Mobile signal. To check the signal strength in your area, go to www.t-mobile.com/coverage/coverage-map and enter your address. Please charge the hotspot before use. To turn the hotspot on/off, press and hold down the power button for a few seconds until it lights up. The network name will be **Lake Travis Library MH 1/2/3/4/5/...** The password is written on the front of the hotspot.

As with other library materials, it is the parent or legal guardian of minor children who must assume ultimate responsibility for supervising access to internet resources. GETTING TO KNOW YOUR MOBILE HOTSPOT



LED DESCRIPTION

Part	Description
Power Key	Hold the Power key for 3 seconds to turn the device on/off.
WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) Key	Hold the WPS key for 3 seconds to activate the WPS function. Once activated, the Wi-Fi LED indicator will flash every two seconds. If the network is not accessed within 2 minutes, the device will automatically exit the WPS mode.
LED Indicators	Displays Wi-Fi, signal, battery, and SMS status.
Charging in USB port	Use the USB Type-C port to charge your device and connect your device to the hotspot via the USB cable.
Charging Out of USB port	Use the USB port to charge other devices such as tablets and smartphones.
Reboot	Hold Power key for 10 seconds to restart device.

LED INDICATORS

Wi-Fi Indicator

- **Solid Blue** – Wi-Fi is active
- **Flashing Blue** – WPS mode is active

Signal Indicator

- **Solid Blue** – Registered and connected to network. Good coverage: 3 LEDs all light up, Middle coverage: 2 LEDs light up, Weak coverage: 1 LED lights up.
- **Flashing Blue** – Network disconnected.
- **Solid Red** – No network.

Battery Indicator

- **Solid Blue** – 3 LEDs light up blue: battery level 80%-100%, 2 LEDs light up blue: 40%-79%, 1 LED lights up blue: battery level 15%-39%.
- **Solid Red** – 1 LED lights up red: battery level 0%-14%.
- **Flashing** – LEDs will flash while charging. Once the battery level is at 100%, 3 LEDs will display solid blue.
